You'll also have the chance to do some early holiday shopping at our "mini bazaar." You may pay with check, credit card or cash (exact change).



2014 JAS Board Nominations Made



Recipe

Japanese pancake (Okonomiyaki)

eat flour
water
nilk
salt

Vegetable oil, Chuno sauce, and Mayonnaise to taste

Directions

1) Cut the pork into 2" lengths, chop the cabbage.

2) Beat the eggs in a bowl, mix with flour, water, milk and salt to form a batter.

3) Blend the pork and cabbage into the batter. Add beni shouga and mix well.

4) Heat frying pan or hot plate with vegetable oil. Pour in the combined ingredients/batter, using a circular motion. Cook at medium heat for about 3 minutes.

5) When the bottom of the pancake is light brown, turn it over and cook for about 3 minutes. Then reduce heat to low, cook both sides for about another 3 minutes each.

6) Spread with chuno sauce and mayonnaise. Oishii!



Bylaws Changes to Be Voted on in November 12 Meeting

The Heart of America Japan-America Society Board of Directors helps run our organization's current activities, but we also look to the future. Because bylaws are essentially the rules for how to govern the society, the Board of Directors has recently discussed changes needed to refine several bylaws to help the board operate more effectively.

The Board of Directors of the Heart of America Japan-America Society is recommending the following amendments to the Bylaws of the Society, for approval by the members of the Society at the general meeting on November 12, 2013.

1. Amending Article VII, Section 1, to provide that if the Board position of immediate past President of the Society cannot be filled because the immediate past President has been immediate past President for a year or longer, or the immediate past President

refuses or is otherwise unable to serve, then the Board may either (i) appoint another person to serve as the ninth member of the Board, or (ii) decide to leave that Board position unfilled, in which case the Board will consist of only eight members.

Section 1, with the recommended new language underlined, is as follows:

The Board of Directors shall be the governing body of the Society. It shall consist of the President, 1st Vicepresident, 2nd Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Society, as elected by the members of the Society, three (3) additional directors elected by the members of the Society, and the immediate past President of the Society; provided, the immediate past President shall serve on the Board of Directors, as immediate past President, only during the one (1) year immediately following that person's term as President of the Society; further provided, if the position of immediate past president on the Board of Directors cannot be filled because there is no eligible candidate, refusal of an eligible candidate to serve, or any other similar reason, then the newly elected Board may designate another person to serve as the 9th Director or may decide to leave that directorship unfilled. No person shall simultaneously hold more than one (1) position on the Board of Directors. No person shall serve on the Board of Directors for longer than six consecutive years; provided, this limitation shall not apply to a person serving on the Board of Directors as immediate past President of the Society. Any interim vacancy on the Board shall be filled by the Board itself.

2. Amending Article VII, Section 2, to provide that any decision of the Board must be by a majority of all Directors then in office (rather than by merely a majority of the Directors present at meeting of the Directors at which a quorum is present).

Section 2, with the recommended new language underlined, is as follows:

The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. Any decision of the Board must be by majority vote <u>of all Directors</u>.

3. Adding a new Section 3 to Article VII to provide that the Board may hold meetings by telephone or other electronic means of communication.


Recommended new Section 3 is as follows:

One or more Directors may participate in a regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors by, or conduct the meeting through the use of, any means of communication by which all Directors participating may simultaneously hear each other during the meeting. A Director participating in a meeting by this means is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.

4. Renumbering (old) Section 3 of Article VII as (new) Section 4.
